Minn. Stat. 10A.02, subd 11 - Violations; enforcement.

The board shall investigate any alleged violation filed in writing with the board. For an alleged violation of sections 10A.25 (expenditure limits) or 10A.27 (additional limits) the board shall either enter into a conciliation agreement or make a public finding of whether or not there is probable cause, within 60 days of the filing of the complaint. For alleged violations of all other sections, the board shall within 30 days after the filing of the complaint make a public finding of whether or not there is probable cause to believe a violation has occurred.

The deadline for action may be extended by a majority vote of the board. Within a reasonable time after beginning an investigation of an individual or association, the board shall notify that individual or association of the fact of the investigation. The board shall make no finding without notifying the individual or association of the nature of the allegations and affording an opportunity to answer those allegations.

Any hearing or action of the board concerning a complaint or investigation shall be confidential until the board makes a public finding concerning probable cause or enters into a conciliation agreement.

Except as provided in section 10A.28, after the board makes a public finding of probable cause the board shall report that finding to the appropriate law enforcement authorities.

## Nature of Complaint Against Daniel Scheck and Carol Overland

I believe that Mr. Daniel Schleck and Ms. Carol Overland have violated Minn. Stat. § 10A.03 by failing to register as lobbyists in connection with their respective representations of the Coalition for Sensible Siting (CSS) and Goodhue Wind Truth (GWT) in certificate of need and siting matters before the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission.

Mr. Schleck and Ms. Overland represent parties before the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission lobbying against the certificate of need and site permit applications of AWA Goodhue, LLC for a 78 megawatt wind project in Goodhue County, Minnesota. AWA Goodhue applied for a certificate of need and site permit in October of 2009 (MPUC Dockets IP6701/CN-09-1186 and IP6701/WS-08-1233). Ms. Overland filed a motion to intervene on behalf of GWT in February 2010 (Exhibit A). Mr. Schleck filed a motion to intervene and notice of appearance on behalf of CSS in November 2010 (Exhibit B). Ms. Overland filed another motion to intervene and notice of appearance on behalf of GWT in October 2010 (Exhibit C). In connection with these lobbying activities, Mr. Schleck and Ms. Overland participated in public hearings and a contested case proceeding, including preparing and filing testimony, briefs and other filings and appearing before the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission.

According to GWT's website ([www.goodhuewindtruth.com](http://www.goodhuewindtruth.com)), CSS is the fundraising arm for both organizations. GWT's website also states that the organizations have raised over \$100,000 to date to pay for legal fees and other lobbying efforts at local, state and federal levels attempting to fight the AWA Goodhue wind project (Exhibit D). CSS's website ([www.coalitionforsensiblesiting.com](http://www.coalitionforsensiblesiting.com)) confirms that money donated to CSS funds, in part, legal fees, research and advice (Exhibit E). Based on the information provided on the organizations' websites, it is evident that Mr. Schleck and Ms. Overland have been paid more than \$3,000 for their lobbying activities, and, accordingly, should have registered as lobbyists under Minn. Stat. § 10A.03.

Given the amount of money raised in this lobbying effort, the Campaign Finance Board should also investigate whether any members or volunteers for the Coalition for Sensible Siting or Goodhue Wind Truth should also be registered as lobbyists as individuals who have spent more than \$250 in any year for the purpose of attempting to influence legislative or administrative action in connection with the AWA Goodhue wind project. As noted on GWT's webpage and the attached affidavits of Marie McNamara and Steve Groth (Exhibit F), both organizations have engaged in extensive public outreach efforts to encourage others to contact their state legislators, congressional representatives and the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission. As noted in Exhibits A, B, C, and F, these activities extend beyond participation in the AWA Goodhue matter and also include other proceedings before the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission.

It is important that all parties in these matters be held to the same standards, and that the public have adequate disclosure of all lobbying activities, including the opposition lobbying activities spearheaded by Mr. Schleck, Ms. Overland, the Coalition for Sensible Siting and Goodhue Wind Truth.

Goodhue Wind Truth hereby makes this Petition for Intervention as a full party, with all the rights of a party. Goodhue Wind Truth is an organization of affected landowners and residents within and in the immediate vicinity of the proposed Goodhue Wind Project.

Members of Goodhue Wind Truth will be directly affected by the outcome of this proceeding if a Siting Permit and Certificate of Need were to be granted, and if Power Purchase Agreements were to be approved. Participation in these dockets is necessary, because Goodhue Wind Truth wishes to protect our interests and develop the record through discovery, testimony (if funding allows), cross-examination, motions, and briefing.

Under the provisions of Minn.R. 1400.6200, subp.1, and 1405.0900, subp. 1, Goodhue Wind Truth makes this Petition for an Order granting intervention in these dockets as a full party, with all the rights of a party, in the above-captioned proceedings.

Goodhue Wind Truth has been an active and credible participant in the Goodhue Wind, a/k/a AWA Goodhue Wind, Siting, Certificate of Need, and Power Purchase Agreement dockets at the Commission. Goodhue Wind Truth has also participated in the Commission's docket regarding Public Health Impacts of Wind Turbines (09-845) and the Bent Tree project docket. Goodhue Wind Truth seeks to intervene in the Siting, Certificate of Need, and Power Purchase Agreement dockets to help build and

inform the record regarding the siting criteria, project impacts, need for this project, whether it qualifies as a Community Based Energy Development project because of ownership structure and composition, and the financing for the project.

The position of Goodhue Wind Truth, at this point, as a participant thus far in these dockets, is that this project is not what it claims to be, that misrepresentations of turbine sites and wind rights acquisitions have been made; that if sited as proposed, it will have an impact on local residents and property that cannot be mitigated; that it is not a C-BED project as defined under Minnesota law; that it should not be utilized by Xcel Energy or any other buyer for compliance with the Renewable Energy Standard; and that it does not take into account all costs associated with this project, particularly transmission interconnection. The Minnesota Office of Energy Security has also taken an interest into the issue of whether this project qualifies as a C-BED project. As the record is built, other issues may be revealed. All aspects of this project deserve closer scrutiny by the Commission.

Goodhue Wind Truth's interests in landowner rights, wind project economics and project organizational status, and participatory process are distinct from that of any other parties. The record of these proceedings must be broadly developed in order to be capable of supporting any decision.

Goodhue Wind Truth meets the criteria for intervention and respectfully requests that it be granted intervention as a full party, with all the rights of a party, in the above-captioned Siting, Certificate of Need and Power Purchase Agreement proceedings.

The Coalition for Sensible Siting, Inc. ("CSS") makes this Petition for Intervention as a full party, with all the rights of a party.

CSS was formed by a group of landowners and municipal communities that have standing to intervene in this contested case hearing and are located near or within the boundaries of the proposed AWA Goodhue Wind Project. Members of CSS have actively participated in various dockets before the Public Utilities Commission ("PUC"), including the AWA Goodhue Draft Siting Permit, Certificate of Need, Power Purchase Agreement and Siting dockets and before the Goodhue County Board, Planning Commission and Wind Ordinance Subcommittee.

On October 21, 2010 the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission requested the Administrative Law Judge ("ALJ") assigned to this matter to develop a record on every standard in Article 18 that is more stringent than what the Commission has heretofore applied to Large Wind Energy Conversion Systems ("LWECS") and make recommendations regarding each such standard whether the Commission should adopt it for LWECS in Goodhue County.

The PUC has further requested the ALJ assigned to this matter to allow the parties to develop a factual record on the question of "good cause" as that term appears in Minn. Stat. § 216F.081 and to provide recommendations on whether, with respect to each standard in Article 18 of the Goodhue County Ordinances identified in the course of her review as "more stringent" than what the Commission has heretofore applied to LWECS, there is "good cause" for the Commission to not apply the standard to sitting LWECS in Goodhue County.

Lastly, the PUC has requested the ALJ to include, without limitation whether there is sufficient evidence regarding health and safety to support a 10 rotor diameter set-back for non-participating residents and the stray voltage requirements.

Members of CSS will be directly affected by the outcome of this proceeding if a Siting Permit and Certificate of Need were to be granted CSS's participation in this docket is necessary, because CSS wishes to protect its member's interests and develop the record through discovery, testimony, cross-examination, motions, and briefing, and preserve its right to appeal.

Under the provisions of Minn.R. 1400.6200, subp.1, and 1405.0900, subp. 1, CSS makes this Petition for an Order granting intervention in these dockets as a full party, with all the rights of a party, in the above-captioned proceedings.

CSS has previously been active in participating in the AWA Goodhue Wind dockets at the PUC and local governmental level. CSS has also participated in the Commission's docket regarding Public Health Impacts of Wind Turbines (09-845) and the Bent Tree project docket.

CSS's interests in health impacts of wind turbines, noise, flicker, impacts on public infrastructure, stray voltage and magnetic fields, landowner rights, wind project economics and project organizational status, and participatory process are distinct from that of any other parties. The record of these proceedings must be broadly developed in order to be capable of supporting any decision.

CSS meets the criteria for intervention and respectfully requests that it be granted intervention as a full party, with all the rights of a party, in the above-captioned Siting Permit, Certificate of Need and Power Purchase Agreement proceedings.



#### **TOWNSHIP NEWS**

Belle Creek Township has a one-year moratorium on wind development in effect. A Belle Creek Road Agreement is being developed. Belle Creek Township is not allowing AWA Goodhue Wind to proceed with core drilling of its roads.

Belle Creek is a party for the Reconsideration Hearing process and has decided on any necessary path to the Court of Appeals. The Township welcomes suggestions for their Comprehensive Plan development.

Industrial-scale, electrical-generating wind projects demand a huge amount of prime farm land in southeastern MN and throughout our country. We want to ensure that what has led to failure in previous projects all over the country does not happen here. While working through the proposed projects in the area, we are educating ourselves and the community on the many aspects of industrial wind power. **Our concerns for the Community:**

Concerns for the community stem from issues and complaints that residents of existing industrial wind turbine

developments are forced to live with on a daily basis all over the country. The wind developers along with doctors and sound and vibration engineers all agree that 50 dBa is too loud and very intrusive to the surrounding residents, but the state has not revised the requirements.
